


# Let the Numbers Tell the Story

## A QUICK GLANCE AT OUR NUMBERS



## Youth Coaches Level Up!

### YOUTH COACHES LEVEL UP AS MORE SEEK TO START

Last October 26-30, 2022, Fairplay's first youth coaching product joined the AFC Futsal level 1 led by Vic Hermans, Coach of the National Women's Futsal Team.

Ronalyn (center photo) is a Fairplay Level 3 Coach, and all Fairplay Level 3 Coaches are supported by Fairplay to join official coaching courses. This step means Ronalyn, should she pass, will have an official FIFA coaching license valid throughout the world.

She also represents the first Payatas born and bred coach to join the FIFA Courses.

Ronalyn said it was a challenge, with many tough but ultimately really good parts that will help her learn and improve.

Meanwhile, two of our Level 1 coaches have graduated to become Fairplay Level 2 coaches (pictured above). Loren Joyce (left) and Althea (right) are also Fairplay Scholars and passed the Fairplay Level 2 Coaching Courses. They are now in charge of handling specific age groups.

More younger players are becoming interested in coaching too, with 13 new Level 1 coaches beginning their duties as assistants. This is good news as more and more kids are playing football in Payatas and demand for training sessions increases.



All youth coaches earn an allowance per session as they learn the ropes. This means they can avoid more hazardous work, such as scavenging, and focus on their education and future.

## Courtesy Call at the City Hall

### TEAM PHILIPPINES SCWC VISIT QUEZON CITY MAYOR BELMONTE

More than a month after they competed in Doha at the Street Child World Cup, Team Philippines SCWC paid a courtesy call last December 2, 2022 at the Quezon City Hall and met Mayor Joy Belmonte who welcomed them warmly.

Seven of the ten players of the team are Quezon City residents, so it was an honor to sit down with the Mayor, share their experience in Doha and their personal aspirations as student athletes, as well as hear about the City's plans for sports, especially futsal and football. They also presented to the Mayor the Congress Declaration of Team Philippines, which stated their advocacies.~

# Team Philippines: Street Child World Cup

## PHILIPPINES REACH SEMI-FINALS OF SCWC AND WIN FAIRPLAY & MVP AWARDS

**SUMMARY:** In October, 2022, Fairplay sent Team Philippines to the Street Child World Cup. Ten players came from different organisations, 6 from Payatas FC, 2 from Gawad Kalinga, and 2 from Tondo FC, to represent the country on and off the field in this international competition.

From the try-outs, and preparation, to the tournament in Qatar, it was an intense and challenging experience for the team. They enjoyed

Following up the experience, we conducted Focus Group Discussions with the players to hear their thoughts and experiences on what was good and what they would like to see improved.

The girls shared how they loved meeting and connecting with people from countries all over the world. A particular highlight was their cultural presentation, where they performed a mashup of traditional and modern Philippine dances. They also deeply appreciated the immense love and support they received from Filipinos in Qatar itself.

The girls also encountered many challenges, such as full schedules of training, mentoring sessions, and other engagements. They had to adapt to new people and new environments. Through time and effort, they were able to work, improve, and have fun together as a team. They supported each other and scored one goal at a time.

The team regards the months of preparation and competing as a momentous and once-in-a-lifetime experience. They are especially grateful for the unique opportunity. They carry with them the pleasant memories that paved their growth and will further lead them toward their journey of personal development.

## WHAT'S NEXT? OPPORTUNITIES MOVING FORWARD

A majority of the Team Philippines SCWC 2022 players are also Fairplay Scholars, and support for them will continue through. Several of the players will be trying out for the Philippine National Youth Team in January, and working towards Varsity Scholarships for College. Several of the players will be graduating Senior High School this school year and so will try-out for the top Universities in the country.

The other players and candidates are under the care of their respective organizations and football clubs where they will be supported in the next steps of their journey as student athletes.

At Fairplay, we hope to retain the positive experiences, learn from the challenges, and develop a sustainable program for Team Philippines. We are planning more regular Summer Camps for Team Philippines to ensure the program is not a once every four years project, but can leverage the best of the Street Child World Cup and build on this experience year on year with our partner organisations. ## WE LOOK BACK AT 2022 WITH GRATEFUL HEARTS AND FORWARD TO 2023 WITH HOPE

We have had an awesome ride in 2022! We experienced the toning down of pandemic restrictions in the Philippines overall, and this catapulted our operations back to 100%.

At our Youth Center, group tutorials and EQ Club sessions had full attendance from among Fairplay Scholars and flourished. We also saw our students come in regularly to use the computer and Internet for their online classes and modules. We launched the English Boot Camp during the school break, and initiated more youth clubs during the final quarter of 2022. We produced 3 college graduates in 2022 who finished at the top of their class, and watched as the rest of the Fairplay Scholars got promoted to the next grade level.

At our Payatas Sports Center, we witnessed our facility come alive again in full force with new and old players resuming training sessions. Our Payatas FC Women's Team joined 2 seasons of the AIA 7s Football League, playing every Sunday for half of the year. We organized Team Philippines and sent 10 players to Doha for the Street Child World Cup. We organized the Fairplay Futsal League and Fairplay Cups, with community teams from all over Metro Manila joining. With the number of kids and youth playing, we mentored new youth coaches to handle and assist training sessions.

Behind the scenes, our Fairplay Cafe developed new dishes and fed our scholars and players throughout the year and catered during Fairplay events and activities. That is roughly 24,000 meals for the year!

With all of our achievements in 2022, we look back with nothing but thankfulness for a successful year and look forward to a new year full of energy, hope and optimism!~
