Celebrating the Graduates Batch '23

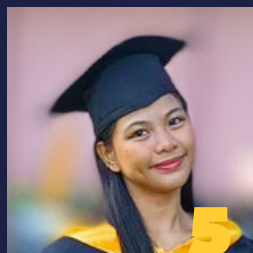
July is graduation season and this year, we have many graduates to celebrate!

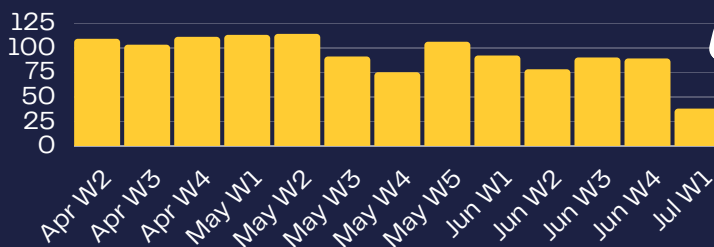

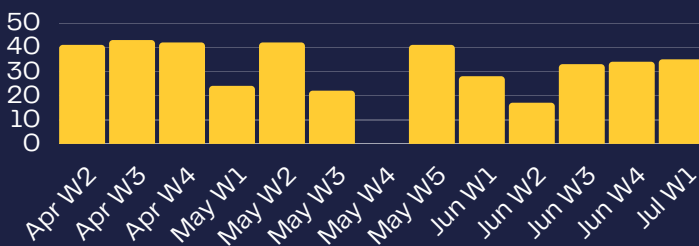

More Game Time to Develop Kids

PAYATAS FC HOSTS FAIRPLAY FUTSAL LEAGUE AND CUP

Last May 28, 2023, Fairplay concluded the 1st Season of the Fairplay Futsal League 2023. The league duration was 3 weeks with both U11s and U13s having 7 teams in each group. Double round robin was used, and each team had 4 games each week equivalent to 40 minutes.

The Fairplay Futsal League is designed with development in mind, so that means everyone can join and have fun. It is a good opportunity for the other teams as well as Payatas to see the kids' development each week; the coaches and the players can see their own progress and assess which area to improve on. According to Fairplay's Sports Manager, Coach Ronalyn Lagata, "It's good to see the level of everyone there, and also to reward the kids with a fun and friendly league for their efforts in the training sessions."

After the successful Fairplay Futsal League, and in preparation of the World Fairplay Soccer Championship the Sports Department organized the 3 V 3 Payatas Cup in June. The fun tournament was for Payatas-based players and was held every Sunday. As per Coach Ronalyn, "It's good to end their week with something like a tournament set-up, so every week they have something they can look forward." Small-sided games like 2 vs 2 or 3 vs 3 are good for players' development because there is a smaller number of people inside the court and the small spaces challenge them to play smart, be creative, and improve their technical skills such as dribbling, ball control, passing, and shooting.

"It is nice to see the kids grow and see them having their best time playing the sport and just being kids having fun with their friends," continued Coach Ronalyn. "This is something that we can regularly implement in our sports center."~

Payatas FC Women Win Bronze in Germany

PAYATAS FC REPRESENTED THE PHILIPPINES IN THE WORLD FAIRPLAY SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP

This year we were so fortunate to be invited to represent the Philippines at the 2023 World Fairplay Soccer Championship. The 3v3 tournament is designed to encourage Fairplay, with special rules that challenge players to balance their competitiveness with self-regulation.

The week-long football event included men and women's teams from Germany, Austria, Canada, Mongolia, the Netherlands, Italy, Latvia, USA, and the Philippines. Our team was among the youngest, and the boys among the shortest! Meeting new people from other countries and making friends was a highlight for our players.

For many of our players, it was the first time they've ever been on the plane, on a large train, and being abroad, especially in a European country. The team was unused to the cold climate and weather despite it being summer in Europe, while the language can be rather challenging to navigate. But probably the most culturally shocking for the kids was the food--where is the rice?! Nevertheless, everyone had an amazing time!

At the event, the Philippines performed a mash up of several cultural dances for the cultural performance as well as hosted the Level 1 Fairplay Coaching Course for all participants. With over 50 people joining the course, it was the largest one we have hosted so far. With the introduction of Fairplay Coaching focusing on ensuring the kids have fun, make friends, feel cared for, and see their improvement, the overlap was encouraging and several teams expressed they got a lot out of that.

On the pitch, the girls finished the group stage with 10 wins, 2 draws, and 2 losses, finishing at 2nd seed behind Mongolia, while the boys managed 2 draws and 12 losses against the men's teams. A win over the USA in the Quarter Finals set up a Semi Final match for the girls against Latvia. An upset 2-1 loss meant a battle for bronze with Mongolia, who likewise suffered a surprise defeat to Italy. It took penalties to separate the two Asian countries, with Aicele, Ronalyn, and Althea scoring to win 3-2 and win the bronze medals.

More than the results on the pitch, the inspiration these girls provide in the local community is far more encouraging. Ronalyn is the Sports Manager at Fairplay, helping to ensure roughly 200 kids have somewhere to play every week. Loren and Althea are Level 2 Fairplay Coaches, coaching the age groups each day, while they now leave this school year for Varsity Scholarships at PUP and FEU respectively. Aicele is a Level 1 Coach and soon to be tutor as she improved her grades from near failing to become the top in her class over the last year two years.

This tournament was an excellent time to reward and enjoy this progress on and off the field. The medals and trophies are nice to have, but the change that our young people keep making in our community is the real reward.

We will also be looking at implementing the Fairplay system within our youth leagues too. This can include waiting for teams to call their own fouls and stop play when needed, docking Fairplay points if teams do not call their fouls and stop at possible injuries, while also looking at setting up the Fairplay table for the teams to discuss what happened with our youth referees after the game.~

PAYATAS FC FINISH 3RD PLACE IN HIGH 5 FUTSAL LEAGUE, 3 PAYATAS PLAYERS CALLED UP FOR NATIONAL FUTSAL TEAM

The High 5 Futsal League was founded and kicked off this year to begin scouting and developing the National Futsal Team. For the Women's game, this was the first season played at Tuloy's full size futsal court and the first time Payatas FC joined. Full length futsal games on a full size futsal court was a fantastic experience for our team. The players had a goal to train for, with games every weekend, and they worked hard to reach those goals.

As the highest level of competitive futsal in the country, there were 4 foundation teams and 4 clubs. In the league portion of the season, Payatas FC had 6 wins and 2 losses to finish 2nd in the table. It was no secret that on the pitch we relied on several special talents. Agot was MVP of the League scoring 15 goals in the 9 games of the entire season (league plus playoffs). Althea scored 10 goals while playing as primarily a defender, to be joint 2nd top scorer. This gave the platform for many younger players to get more game time than they would have elsewhere. Indeed, we had the youngest player in the entire competition – 12 year old Ashely – who grabbed herself several goals and assists across several games.

Following the league, three of our players, in Althea, Agot, and our goalkeeper Jas, were invited to the National pool for the four nation tournament scheduled this year. The four-nation tournament will see the Philippines host New Zealand, Guam, and either Taiwan or the Northern Mariana Islands. Having several National Football Youth players, this would be the first time Payatas FC players will represent the country at Senior level if they make the final cut.

We are excited to announce next time round just how many of the players earned Varsity Scholarships to Senior High School and to College. But for now, the younger kids know there is an end goal and our older players know they will pay it forward – coaching the next generation of players, tutoring the next generation of students, and leading the next generation of leaders.~
